TWO ANGELS CABERNET SAUVIGNON 2011



Description:

The fourth vintage of Mayacamas Mountain Cabernet Sauvignon features good complexity, with cedar, briary, anise and dark berry notes. This "medium-plus" bodied wine has good weight, wonderful balance and sufficient tannins for aging, although they are nicely restrained. The flavors carry through very well across the whole palate. It shows great elegance as it glides across the palate and leads to a pleasing finish.

Winemaker's Notes:

The grapes for Two Angels Mayacamas Mountain Cabernet Sauvignon come from vineyards at, or near, the top of the Mayacamas Mountain range, which divides the Napa Valley from Sonoma Valley, and is now called Moon Mountain District, one of the newest California appellations. This vintage was aged for 18 months in French oak barrels, about 30% new.

Interesting Fact:

The label art was created by Jacob de Backer in 1591. The theme of the piece is the hilarity of inebriation and the trauma of the morning after. Excessive joy must be countered by equally excessive sorrow, with penitential atonement for pleasure (the first "Drink Responsibly" print campaign).

Serve at room temperature with steaks and other grilled meats, roasts and hearty fare.
