The 2019 Frans Malan Reserve, a blend of 58% Pinotage, 27% Cabernet Sauvignon and 15% Merlot, offers a vivid display of red fruits, complex layers and fresh, spicy elements complemented by floral touches. The palate reveals black raspberry, dusty cassis and oak alongside earthy spices and soft herbals. Medium to full-bodied, it possesses a good weight and achieves a balanced interplay of acidity and tannic structure, finishing with a food-friendly elegance

This is nicely crafted and should give several years of pleasure."
